



TASKS TO PREPARE FOR THE GREEK MEETING

TASK 1: TAKE A MINI INTERVIEW OF AN IMMIGRANT/REFUGEE STUDENT

The purpose of this activity is to make students practice on research and the technical details of taking an interview. We recommend the following steps:

- Every country must take an interview of an immigrant or refugee student of their school.
- The interview should consist of at least these four questions
 - o Where are you from and how did you come to (Greece/Austria/Spain/Italy/Portugal)?
 - o Can you please share with us a positive or negative experience from school related to you coming from another country?
 - o If your class was about to receive a student from another country tomorrow , what would you do or suggest to be done to make him feel better?
 - o What are your dreams for the future?
- The interview should be minimum length of 3 minutes and maximum of 7 minutes and will be uploaded to the Google Drive at the C3-Greece folder before April 1st using a file name e.g.: Task1-Greece.mp4.
- You could use any language but please include English subtitling in the video We will use all these interviews during the week in Greece in order to understand the fundamentals of movie making.
- This interview could be also used for the video each of us has to prepare for Austria.

TASK 2: SCREENING OF A DOCUMENTARY



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The purpose of this activity is to learn more about making a real life documentary and get more involved in the refugee problem.

Organize a screening for your students involved in the project, of the movie “4.1 Miles” by Daphne Matziaraki who is a Greek director, writer and producer. Her thesis-film 4.1 Miles received critical appraisal and recognition earning her a Gold Medal at 43rd Annual Student Academy Awards. The film received a nomination for Academy Award for Best Documentary Short Subject at the 89th Academy Awards.
